Chris was born on Sunday 7 April 1957. Others born in April 1957 was David Gower, Seve Ballesteros, Eric Bristow and Daniel Day-Lewis.

Wednesday's first game after he was born, was a 3-1 midweek home win over Portsmouth. United's first game after Chris was born was a 3-0 home win over Liverpool. Wednesday finished 14th in Div 1, Utd were 7th in Div 2. Norwich City finished bottom of Div 3 South, but were re-elected. Man Utd won the Div 1 title, but were beaten 2-1 by Aston Villa in the FA Cup Final. Stan Matthews made his final England appearance.

The County Cricket title went to Surrey who was 94 points in front of second place Nottinghamshire. Yorkshire was a further 28 points behind in third place. Lew Hoad and Althea Gibson took the Wimbledon titles.


Among the many great films released in 1957 was "12 Angry Men", "Bridge on the River Kwai" and "Jailhouse Rock". Top of the charts when Chris was born was "Young Love" by Tab Hunter and a few days afterwards "Cumberland Gap" by Lonnie Donegan was top. Other big hits in 1957 included "All Shook Up" by Elvis Presley and "That'll be the Day" by The Crickets.

Colin Bland Birthday 10/04/43

On Saturday 10 April 1943 Colin was born. Others born in April 1943 was cricketer Dennis Amiss, horror writer James Herbert, actress Ruth Madoc and singer Bobby Vee. In 1943 Wednesday won the North Cup beating Blackpool 4-3 over 2 legs. Wed was 3/54 in the North League, Utd 19/54. Wednesday beat United 3-2 at Hillsborough and they drew 0-0 at Bramall Lane. In 1943 the big films included "For Whom the Bell Tolls" and "Casablanca", as well as "Old Mother Riley Detective" and "Old Mother Riley Overseas" starring Arthur Lucan. Vera Lynn was the UK music star including "As Time Goes By". The US top songs were Bing Crosby "White Christmas" & "Sunday, Monday & Always", "Zing! Went the Strings of My Heart" by Judy Garland, and Glenn Miller with "That Old Black Magic".

The top films in 1956 included The Ten Commandments, Around the World in 80 Days, Giant and The King & I. The top music in 1956 included Doris Day - Whatever Will Be Will Be (Que Sera Sera); Johnnie Ray - Just Walkin' In The Rain; Elvis Presley Heartbreak Hotel & Hound Dog; Teenagers featuring Frankie Lymon Why Do Fools Fall In Love; Dean Martin - Memories Are Made Of This; Bill Haley & His Comets - Rock Around The Clock

The top films in 1964 included My Fair Lady, Goldfinger, Mary Poppins, From Russia with Love, A Fistful of Dollars and A Hard Day's Night. The top music included Jim Reeves - I Love You Because; Roy Orbison - Oh Pretty Woman; The Beatles - A Hard Day's Night; Cilla Black - Anyone Who Had A Heart; The Searchers - Needles And Pins; Manfred Mann Do Wah Diddy Diddy

Dave Bates Birthday 26/04/54

On Monday 26 April 1954 Dave was born. Also born in April 1954 was Jackie Chan, Dennis Quaid, Iain Duncan Smith, Trevor Francis and Jerry Seinfeld. United beat Aston Villa 2-1 at Bramall Lane in the last league game of the season. Two days earlier, Wednesday had drawn 2-2 at Cardiff City. In the 1953-54 season, United beat Wednesday 2-0 at Bramall Lane, but Wednesday won 3-2 at Hillsborough. Wednesday also beat United 3-1 in an FA Cup 3rd Round replay after a 1-1 draw at Hillsborough. The two cup ties drew a combined crowd of 102,000. Wednesday reached the semi-finals before losing 2-0 to Preston NE. The Cup was won by West Brom, beating Preston 3-2, whilst Division 1 was won by Wolves. Liverpool were relegated. The World Cup was won by West Germany 3-2 against Hungary. A surprise result as Hungary had beaten them 8-3 in the Group stage. England reached the quarter finals before losing 4-2 to Uruguay. Scotland went out at the group stage after a 7-0 defeat by Uruguay.



Two weeks after Dave was born, Roger Bannister became the first man to run the mile in under 4 minutes. Surrey won the County Championship, with Yorkshire 2nd, Derbyshire 3rd and Notts 5th. Jaroslav Drobný beat Ken Rosewall in the Wimbledon final. The Rugby 5 Nations was shared by England Wales and France - the first time France had won or shared the title. Fred Davis was World Snooker champion. Included in the top records of 1954 was the following: Doris Day - Secret Love; David Whitfield With Mantovani & His Orchestra - Cara Mia; Eddie Calvert - Oh Mein Papa; Frank Sinatra - Three Coins In The Fountain; Nat 'King' Cole - Smile and Rosemary Clooney - This Ole House.

The top three films in 1954 were Alfred Hitchcock's Rear Window; White Christmas starring Bing Crosby and Danny Kaye and Disney's 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea

















When Dave became a teenager in 1967

The first late August Bank Holiday - prior to that it had been the 1st Monday in August. United drew 2-2 at Hillsborough and beat Wednesday 1-0 at Bramall Lane with a Bill Punton goal. Jack Charlton of Leeds Utd was Footballer of the year. Spurs beat Chelsea 2-1 to win the Cup. Man Utd were champions and Ron Davies (Soton) was leading scorer (37). Yorkshire were County Champions. The top music in 1967 was "San Francisco" by Scott McKenzie, "All You Need is Love" by The Beatles, "I'll Never Fall in Love Again" by Tom Jones. The top films were, "Fistful of Dollars", "You Only Live Twice and "The Dirty Dozen".
