In the 1949/50 season, Liverpool finished 8<sup>th</sup> in Division One & Everton finished 18<sup>th</sup>. United finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in Division Two, being pipped to promotion by Wednesday by goal average. Wednesday's was .008 better – if it had been the current system, United would have been promoted by virtue of scoring one more goal than Wednesday after having the same goal difference. Wednesday won 2-1 at Hillsborough while United won 2-0 at the Lane. Liverpool drew 0-0 at Everton, but won 3-1 at Anfield. On 5 Nov Liverpool beat Man City 4-0 and were in the middle of a 19 match unbeaten run since the start of the season.

The average house price in 1949 was £1911. Prime Minister was Clement Atlee. The top record in USA on 1 Nov 1949 was "That Lucky Old Sun" by Frankie Lane, followed by another Frankie Laine song "Mule Train". 1949's top film was "Samson & Delilah" starring Victor Mature & Hedy Lamar.

## On 1 November 1962

In the 1961/62 season, Liverpool had been promoted to Division 1 after winning Division 2. During that season Liverpool won 10 & drew 1 of their first 11 games, conceding just 4 goals. They were unbeaten at home all season, winning all but 3 games. One of their 7 defeats was Rotherham away – 1-0. Bill Shankly was manager. Kilmore, ridden by Fred Winter, won the National.

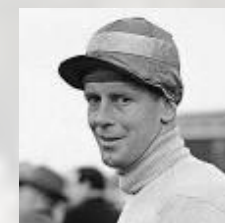
The big films released when Ian was 13 were "The Longest Day" and "How the West was won". Among the top records were "Bobby's Girl" by Susan Maughan and "I Remember You" by Frank Ifield. On 1 Nov, "Telstar" by The Tornados was Number 1.

## On 1 November 1970

The 1969/70 season saw Everton win the League title, Liverpool finished 5<sup>th</sup>. On 31 Oct 1970, Liverpool beat Wolves 2-0 at Anfield. Gay Trip, ridden by Pat Taaffe won the National. The big films released when Ian was 21 were "The Man Who Had Power Over Women" and "The Wild Child". Among the top records were "Band of Gold" by Freda Payne and "Ruby Tuesday" by Melanie. On 1 Nov "Woodstock" by Matthews Southern Comfort was Number 1.

## On 1 November 1999

Liverpool had finished 7<sup>th</sup> in 1998/99. On 1 Nov 1999, they beat Bradford City 3-1 at Anfield. Bobbyjo, ridden by Paul Carberry won the National. The big films released when Ian was 50 were "There's Something About Mary" and "AntZ". Fittingly, "Flying Without Wings" was Number 1 on 1 Nov. Other hits included "Mambo Number 5" by Lou Vega and "We're going to Ibiza" by The Vengaboys.

## 28/11/87

When Tricia became 21, the top films included "Fatal Attraction" and "Dirty Dancing". No 1 in the charts was "China in Your Hand" by T'Pau. Crystal Peaks shopping centre opened the following March, 1988



## 28/11/1996

When Tricia was 30, No 1 in the charts was "Breathe" by The Prodigy. Two of the top films in 1996 were "Independence Day" and "Jingle All The Way"
