OWLS MEMORY

I'll never forget the excitement of my Dad, a Unitedite, taking me, an 11 year old Wednesdayite, to Bramall Lane on the 12th March 1960. A cold, damp day. United were playing Wednesday in the FA Cup Quarter Finals. The kick-off was always 3 o'clock on a Saturday afternoon and the match always finished at 5.40.

Tension building in my chest. Mi Mam wrapping me in blue and white scarf, woolly hat and gloves and my "big" coat.

Queueing for the bus outside St. Catherine's church, Woodthorpe. Feeling anxious. Would we get on the bus? It was always packed like sardines! Big, gruff men with deep voices, hands ingrained with blue dirt from the pits or steelworks. Talking about Hodgkinson, Springett, Joe Shaw and Peter Swan.

Getting off the bus at the bottom of Granville Road. Jogging to the ground. Dad always walked like a KOYLI on a route march. Weaving in and out of the bodies, all heading the same way. Dad, quick, nimble, protective. Making sure I was alright.

The crowd was heaving outside the ground. Would we get in? More anxiety. Big, shoving, excited men squeezing through the turnstile, up the steps on the muddy hill to the top of the Kop.

One of my earliest, exciting memories, even as a Wednesdayite, was reaching the top of the Bramall Lane Kop, stepping into the huge, covered, reverberating, barn. The darkness giving way to bright sunlight out on the brilliant, green pitch.

Dad bought me my first rosette and had made me a special wooden step to stand on at the match. We got a place half way down the Kop, just above the aisle crossing the heaving, swaying, noisy crowd. Blades and Owls fans packed together. 61 thousand of them! No trouble. Men ensuring the kids were safe and sound.

The game was a blur of excitement, tension, ooohs and aaahs, wit and wisdom. A cacophony of noise. A young lad, a Unitedite, stood by my "step", struggling to see the action. I let him put a foot on my platform. We smiled at each other and shared the thrills.

As the game progressed I found myself usurped, standing half on my "step" clinging on precariously. Then Wednesday's winger, Wilkinson scored. He scored again. My discomfort didn't matter. I was ecstatic!

My new friend and step-grabber was miserable but we didn't fall out. Dad was disappointed but happy for me, his lad. He was philosophical having seen it all before.

As the game ended we mingled with misery and elation, trudging or stepping contentedly to Pond Street bus station to board a crowded No.32 bus. I knew this was my first day of real triumph and felt the particular satisfaction you get from seeing your team, Wednesday, win. Naïve about what would come in future. Many days of disappointment, frustration and "if onlys" that's inherent in being a football fan, a Wednesdayite! With an occasional glimpse of glory.

The World Cup England 1966

I was there in 1966 when England, nay SHEFFIELD, hosted the World Cup finals, Hillsborough, the Cathedral of Football, as we called it then, was the best league ground in the country thanks to Eric Taylor, The Owls' General Manager and genius of a football administrator!

In the group stages Hillsborough and Villa Park hosted Group B which consisted of Argentina, West Germany, Spain and Switzerland.

3 group games were played at Hillsborough and I was determined to see one. I was a 17- year- old grammar school boy whose lovely Dad was a poorly paid Steel Worker who had been made redundant that year after 33 years [less 5 years fighting the Germans]in Jessop-Saville's Foundry.

I could only afford to see one group game and that was the night match, under floodlights, between Spain and Switzerland. These were 2 average European sides with little World Cup pedigree at that time. Nevertheless, this WAS the World Cup, and it seemed so exotic. As a Sheffield Wednesday fan I had seen my lads beat Barcelona, Roma, Lyons, and Utrecht so I was used to European football. However, this was a new adventure, exciting and prestigious.

I remember the long line of flag-poles and 16 national flags along Penistone Road, plus along the length of the top of the cantilever North Stand, the first such stand in this country!

In front of a 32000 crowd Spain won 2-1. I remember the swagger of the Spanish team and the passion of the Swiss fans. "Hop Suisse! Hop Suisse!" they chanted throughout [excuse the spelling and poor accent!]. Colour, noise, excitement. This was something special.

However, the best was yet to come. My lovely Mam and Dad paid for my ticket to see West Germany versus Uruguay in the Quarter Final at Hillsborough. I think it was Saturday afternoon? It WAS a hot, sunny day. These teams had real pedigree. Uruguay were winners of the first ever World Cup Final in 1930. West Germany had won in Berne in 1954, beating the superb Hungary, mighty Magyars of Puskas, in a final dubbed "The Miracle of Berne".

A new level was reached! Here they were in Sheffield, the eyes of the world were on us. 34000 watched the sweet German machine glide smoothly, powerfully across the pitch as the excitable, tricky South Americans did their best to break them down.

The atmosphere was electric. The Uruguayan drums and songs seemed from another world. I seem to remember a vivid blue flag with a huge, yellow, sunburst crest....or it could have been a bad headache. That's exactly what the Uruguayans had at half time, being 2-0 down!

Beckenbauer was like a ballet dancer, on ice, skating round increasingly ferocious tackles. The Uruguayans became more and more frustrated and eventually 2 were sent off, to howls of disgust from their fans, by an English referee, I think.

9 men, however skilful, were no match for the German precision and power, and the final score was 4-0 to the Fatherland.

This was my first, close-up taste of Uruguayan nastiness observed on several other World Cup occasions on TV.

It was also a close up view of the excellent Germans. It was a big crowd. The atmosphere was carnival and electric. We looked on in wonder. How could plucky England ever beat this supreme machine! How indeed!?

As an aside, the news coming through on the first electronic scoreboard in the country [in later years to resemble a game of dyslexic scrabble], on the Kop, was of minnows, North Korea, beating Portugal until the tournament's Golden Boot winner [9 goals], Eusebio scored 4 times to beat them single-handedly.

These were proud, exotic, exciting times to be a football mad teenager in Sheffield. Sheffield, the home of football, the Owls and Hillsborough did the game justice, did England proud. It was an honour to be a small part of football history, that sunny July.
